School Development Days occur on the first day of Terms 1, 2 & 3 and the last two days of Term 4.

## **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

Attendance at school on a daily basis is required by law. If your child is sick or you have a situation arise where you are unable to send your child to school for a day or more, you are required to inform the school of the reason why your child is not attending school.

When your child is absent you need to provide in writing an explanation as to why your child has been absent. This should be returned on the same day your child arrives back at school. If your child is absent for 3 days or more, a phone call to the school is required.

The Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) visits our school on a regular basis and checks the class rolls. If your child has had unexplained absences, the HSLO may contact you therefore it is important that all absences are explained as soon as your child returns to school.

## **ROAD SAFETY REMINDER**

The 40km/h speed limit in school zones operate between 8.00 - 9.30am and 2.30 - 4.00pm on school days.

Please be aware of the time or you could get fined.

Children can be unpredictable and hard to see. It is important that parents and carers observe local school safety initiatives when dropping off and collecting children. Penalties are high and loss of demerit points apply for all fines. The worst penalty is knowing that you've caused an injury to a child.

If you are crossing the road with your child, please be aware of traffic. Remember that watching children is never enough. Keep your child safe by holding their hand as you cross the road.

We also remind all parents and carers, for our children's safety please do NOT park in the school carpark at any time.

# **SAFETY DRILLS** There will be a Lockdown Drill

during lunchtime on **Wednesday 27 November**. Drills such as this are essential so that in the event of an emergency all staff and students are well practised in what they do.

Lockdown is a procedure used when there is an immediate threat to the school e.g. school intruder.

Lockdown minimises access to the school and secures staff and students in rooms. As part of the procedure, everyone must remain in a room until the situation has been declared safe by an authorised person such as the Principal or Police Officer. If you hear our emergency siren on the day, please do not be alarmed.

## **Application for Extended Leave**

The Department of Education no longer accepts family holidays and travel as reasons for exemption from school. These days off are now considered as absences and an application for a 'Certificate of Extended Leave for Travel' must be applied for through the school office and approved by the Principal.

The application needs to be made a minimum of 10 school days prior to the commencement of travel.

# 2019 Swim Scheme and Water Safety Program

In weeks 3 and 4, students from Year 2 to Year 6 participated in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program at Roselands Aquatic Centre. It was a fun-filled 10 days of learning to be safe and having fun around the water.

Students were initially assessed to confirm their abilities and then were grouped accordingly. Students swam either in the shallow or deep end according to their skill level. During the lessons, they had to demonstrate such skills as walking through water, blowing bubbles, submerging, facedown swimming and freestyle swimming. Further to this there was teaching of competitive and survival strokes, games and doing a variety of drills and skills to best enhance their learning and development.

Students have put in a lot of effort over the course of the program where they are now more confident. This allows them to have fun safely in and around the water. Their stroke techniques have improved significantly and they have more knowledge of water safety skills.

As Australians, we spend a lot of our time in and around the water; it is a big part of our culture. For this reason, it's important that we learn water safety and survival skills, so that we can continue to enjoy aquatic activities.








# Student Leadership Election

## The After School Klub - TASK

TASK is Belmore South's provider of before and after school care at school. We operate in the school hall from 6:30am-8:30am & 3pm-6pm, every day of school term

## **BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE SESSIONS**

TASK is open mornings from 6:30am until 8:30am: breakfast is provided

TASK is open afternoons from 3pm-6pm: afternoon tea, activities & homework included

All children at school OUTSIDE regular school hours must be in the care of an adult to ensure their safety.

Costs vary, depending on your family's level of subsidy

Most families will pay between \$2.90-\$7.90 per morning & \$4.42-\$12.06 per afternoon once subsidy is applied.

## **HOLIDAY CARE OPTIONS**

TASK operates at Marrickville West, Wilkins Public, Yeo Park Public, Taverners Hill Public during school holidays.

## **OUR STORY**

TASK was started in 2013 by Madi Morrison and Suzanne Tucker – two mums with 3 children each. We were experiencing the chronic shortage of after school care at our own school in Sydney's Inner West. We began as a small homework club – with 5 children (3 of them ours!) with one educator in a classroom. Our aim was to create a place that combined care, play and homework after school. In 2015, we became approved providers of out of school care. We have grown over six years and now operate in Newcastle, the Central Coast, Tweed Heads and Sydney in 15 schools across the public and independent/catholic school systems. **TASK is an ethically private service** – we channel monies back into our programs, people and resources. Madi and Suzanne are joint and equal owners of TASK. We employ 120 people – all of them from the local communities in and around the schools at which we provide service. Anyone wanting to work with us, please send us a resume. We love spending time with kids and love seeing them try new things, make new friends and develop new skills. We are passionate about improving, every day.

# Drive and park safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools.

You can help keep children safe by remembering the following:

- drop off and pick up children on the school side of the road
- never call out to children from across the road it is very dangerous
- always take extra care when driving in 40km school zones
- follow all parking signs these help keep children as safe as possible
- park responsibly even if this means you have to walk further to the school gate
- never double park it is illegal and puts children at risk
- never do a U-turn or three-point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your children.

When travelling in a car ensure your children:

- use a booster seat if they are aged between 4 and 7 years old – it's the law
- are correctly buckled up in their seatbelts
- always get in and out of the car through the 'safety door' – the rear door on the footpath side of the car
- are never left alone in the car.

# The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

## Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

### Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

## Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

## Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walkina.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

## Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

# How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

## Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

## Step 2

The school endorses your application.

## Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



## Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

#### Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week\*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one Journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off<sup>†</sup>
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.

Secondary students aged 16 and over can travel with a Child/Youth Opal card when carrying a NSW/ACT Senior Secondary Student Concession Card, available from school offices.

† The Opal Transfer Discount doesn't apply when transferring between light rail and Sydney Ferries.
