From The Principal's Desk

Congratulations to our whole school community as we finally get back to Face to Face Teaching. It has been a fabulous effort from our staff, parents/carers and in particular our students who have returned to school enthusiastically. So many smiles and positive interactions have ensued.

The **new normal** we are confronted by requires us to be vigilant with our hygiene practices, practice appropriate Social Distancing, particularly with regard to adults and to remain home if we are sick. We particularly must emphasise the stance of the Department of Education and Ministry of Health.

"Physical distancing of children in schools is not required by the latest AHPPC guidelines. Research has shown limited transmission risk associated with school children in the school environment. Physical distancing requirements remain for adults. All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m) including teachers and support staff, and parents. Schools should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable parents to physically distance from one another and from staff."

At BSPS in line with this directive, we ask that parents do not enter school grounds at any time. If your child is upset by you leaving, please speak to one of the teachers on duty to support you.

With the cooler weather now here, it is time to check that jumpers and jackets have names on them so we can easily return them if left around the school. Please make sure that casual clothing isn't worn at school unless it is a special out-of-uniform day.



New approach to Assessment and Reporting in Semester 1

A new approach to student assessment and reporting will be adopted for Semester 1 2020. Schools are required to provide a simplified written report to parents/carers. The grading of students using the five-point A-E scale is not required. We are currently adjusting our school report and we hope to have reports distributed by the end of term.



VISITORS TO SCHOOL DURING COVID-19

Due to COVID-19, anyone visiting the school is asked to phone the school on 9759-4388 from the front gate.

No access to the school premises is permitted during the pandemic. A staff member will meet you at the front gate and assist you with your enquiry.

If you are collecting your child early, please call the office from the gate and we will escort your child to you.

It is a federal government resource aimed to support parents, carers, educators and young people in managing the many issues associated with online activity. Through the 'Parents and Carers' tab, multiple topics are covered, such as cyberbullying, gaming and unwanted contact. It supports skill development for parents in areas such as online safety basics, privacy controls and having tricky conversations.

It is always important to monitor your child's online and gaming activity, review the classification and ensure that the content is age appropriate.

For example **Fortnite** has an Australian Classification Board Rating of M recommended for players 15 years and up. **Facebook** and social media accounts require users to be at least 13 years old.

Enrol Now for Kindergarten 2021

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2021 are now being accepted. Children born between 1st August 2015 and 31st July 2016 are eligible to enrol.

Steps

- Parents/carers who would like to enrol a child for Kindergarten next year please download the Application to Enrol from our website https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/going-to-a-public-school/translated-documents/enrolment-application
- Email the completed form to the school email address belmoresth-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- Wait to be contacted by the school for supporting documentation.

Once staff have processed the application form, you will be contacted to make an appointment to come to the school to provide original supporting documentation and have a readiness conversation:

- Child's birth certificate for proof of age
- Passports and visas to verify Residency Status
- -100 point Proof of residence (e.g. Driver's license, council rate notice, gas, rental agreement, electricity account).
- Immunisation Certificate
- Health Plans if required (allergy, asthma, anaphylaxis, etc.)

All communications with the school are currently by phone or email. Once you enrol you will be placed on a mailing list to receive any relevant notifications for Kindergarten 2021.

Opportunity Classes

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and talented students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 16 September 2020**.

If you would like to have your child considered for the Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The application website opens on **Tuesday 9 June 2020** and closes on **Friday 26 June 2020**. You must apply by the due date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance. You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The After School Klub - TASK

TASK is Belmore South's provider of before and after school care at school. We operate in the school hall from 6:30am-8:30am & 3pm-6pm, every day of school term

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE SESSIONS

TASK is open mornings from 6:30am until 8:30am: breakfast is provided

TASK is open afternoons from 3pm-6pm: afternoon tea, activities & homework included

All children at school OUTSIDE regular school hours must be in the care of an adult to ensure their safety.

Costs vary, depending on your family's level of subsidy

Most families will pay between \$2.90-\$7.90 per morning & \$4.42-\$12.06 per afternoon once subsidy is applied.

HOLIDAY CARE OPTIONS

TASK operates at Marrickville West, Wilkins Public, Yeo Park Public, Taverners Hill Public during school holidays.

OUR STORY

TASK was started in 2013 by Madi Morrison and Suzanne Tucker – two mums with 3 children each. We were experiencing the chronic shortage of after school care at our own school in Sydney's Inner West. We began as a small homework club – with 5 children (3 of them ours!) with one educator in a classroom. Our aim was to create a place that combined care, play and homework after school. In 2015, we became approved providers of out of school care. We have grown over six years and now operate in Newcastle, the Central Coast, Tweed Heads and Sydney in 15 schools across the public and independent/catholic school systems. **TASK is an ethically private service** – we channel monies back into our programs, people and resources. Madi and Suzanne are joint and equal owners of TASK. We employ 120 people – all of them from the local communities in and around the schools at which we provide service. Anyone wanting to work with us, please send us a resume. We love spending time with kids and love seeing them try new things, make new friends and develop new skills. We are passionate about improving, every day.

Information for parents/carers and students

The department is committed to the continued education of all students across NSW, including advanced learning programs for high potential and gifted students.

The 2021 Year 5 opportunity class placement process was put on hold in April 2020 due to the COVID-19 situation.

We have now rescheduled and streamlined the application process. Please note the details of the changes below and assist parents and carers to understand these changes.

Why have changes been made to the 2020 opportunity class placement process?

Due to the shorter time frame available for the OC placement process, changes have been made to the process for this year. The department is committed to supporting the continuity of learning and transitions for each child, and the revised application and placement process will ensure students are placed in 2021 Year 5 opportunity classes as soon as possible.

What changes have been made?

The 2020 opportunity class placement process has been revised to accommodate the shorter timeline due to the postponement of the test.

To ensure the fair and consistent assessment of students across all schools and regions of NSW, this year students will be placed on test results only. Taking this approach reduces the effect of the disrupted start to the school year, which could compromise school assessment scores, and ensures that all students are placed using the same test performed under the same conditions. The test is created by an independent educational assessment provider and measures academic ability, not achievement, giving a reliable method for identifying highly gifted applicants which is not subject to the variable classroom conditions experienced this year.







What are the key dates I should be aware of?

The revised dates are listed below. Parents are advised to review the new dates carefully and ensure an application is submitted by the closing date for their child to be eligible to sit the placement test as, owing to the shorter timeline, late applications will not be accepted.
