Getting to School on Time

The weather is becoming cooler in the mornings and at this time of year we find many children arrive late to school.

It is important that parents encourage children to arrive at school on time. Classes begin each day at 9.00am. Some children are arriving well after this time and are missing important learning time. Many say they are late due to sleeping in or not being organised.

Being on time each day and only taking sick days when necessary is a vital part of teaching children the importance of being reliable and valuing their education. Being reliable is learnt from an early age and is the responsibility of each parent/carer.

Please also ensure that your child is picked up from school at the conclusion of the school day on time. School finishes at 3.00pm. Students are often left well after the bell and become distressed when parents are late collecting them. If parents/carers are experiencing difficulty being on time in the afternoon Before & After School Care may be of assistance.

Enrol Now for Kindergarten 2021

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2021 are now being accepted. Children born between 1st August 2015 and 31st July 2016 are eligible to enrol.

Steps

- Parents/carers who would like to enrol a child for Kindergarten next year please download the Application to Enrol from our website

- Email the completed form to the school email address belmoresth-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- Wait to be contacted by the school for supporting documentation.

Once staff have processed the application form, you will be contacted to make an appointment to come to the school to provide original supporting documentation and have a readiness conversation:

- Child's birth certificate for proof of age
- Passports and visas to verify Residency Status
- 100 point Proof of residence (e.g. Driver's license, council rate notice, gas, rental agreement, electricity account).
- Immunisation Certificate

- Health Plans if required (allergy, asthma, anaphylaxis, etc.)

All communications with the school are currently by phone or email. Once you enrol you will be placed on a mailing list to receive any relevant notifications for Kindergarten 2021.

If more than one child from the same family is Absent, a separate note is required for each class teacher.

The note should be brought to school on the first day your child returns to school after an absence or emailed to the school.

The school is required to follow up all unexplained absences (where a child has been absent and no explanation has been received) within two days.

Changes to the opportunity class placement process for Year 5 entry in 2021

Information for parents/carers and students

The department is committed to the continued education of all students across NSW, including advanced learning programs for high potential and gifted students.

The 2021 Year 5 opportunity class placement process was put on hold in April 2020 due to the COVID-19 situation.

We have now rescheduled and streamlined the application process. Please note the details of the changes below and assist parents and carers to understand these changes.

Why have changes been made to the 2020 opportunity class placement process?

Due to the shorter time frame available for the OC placement process, changes have been made to the process for this year. The department is committed to supporting the continuity of learning and transitions for each child, and the revised application and placement process will ensure students are placed in 2021 Year 5 opportunity classes as soon as possible.

What changes have been made?

The 2020 opportunity class placement process has been revised to accommodate the shorter timeline due to the postponement of the test.

To ensure the fair and consistent assessment of students across all schools and regions of NSW, this year students will be placed on test results only. Taking this approach reduces the effect of the disrupted start to the school year, which could compromise school assessment scores, and ensures that all students are placed using the same test performed under the same conditions. The test is created by an independent educational assessment provider and measures academic ability, not achievement, giving a reliable method for identifying highly gifted applicants which is not subject to the variable classroom conditions experienced this year.

The revised dates are listed below. Parents are advised to review the new dates carefully and ensure an application is submitted by the closing date for their child to be eligible to sit the placement test as, owing to the shorter timeline, late applications will not be accepted.

TASK is Belmore South's provider of before and after school care at school. We operate in the school hall from 6:30am-8:30am & 3pm-6pm, every day of school term

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE SESSIONS

TASK is open mornings from 6:30am until 8:30am: breakfast is provided TASK is open afternoons from 3pm-6pm: afternoon tea, activities & homework included All children at school OUTSIDE regular school hours must be in the care of an adult to ensure their safety. Families can enrol anytime - <u>https://belmoresouth-task.hubworks.com.au</u> Costs vary, depending on your family's level of subsidy

Most families will pay between \$2.90-\$7.90 per morning & \$4.42-\$12.06 per afternoon once subsidy is applied.

TASK operates at Marrickville West, Wilkins Public, Yeo Park Public, Taverners Hill Public during school holidays.

OUR STORY

TASK was started in 2013 by Madi Morrison and Suzanne Tucker – two mums with 3 children each. We were experiencing the chronic shortage of after school care at our own school in Sydney's Inner West. We began as a small homework club – with 5 children (3 of them ours!) with one educator in a classroom. Our aim was to create a place that combined care, play and homework after school. In 2015, we became approved providers of out of school care. We have grown over six years and now operate in Newcastle, the Central Coast, Tweed Heads and Sydney in 15 schools across the public and independent/catholic school systems. **TASK is an ethically private service** – we channel monies back into our programs, people and resources. Madi and Suzanne are joint and equal owners of TASK. We employ 120 people – all of them from the local communities in and around the schools at which we provide service. Anyone wanting to work with us, please send us a resume. We love spending time with kids and love seeing them try new things, make new friends and develop new skills. We are passionate about improving, every day.






How to Handwash?

WASH HANDS WHEN VISIBLY SOILED! OTHERWISE, USE HANDRUB

Duration of the entire procedure: 40-60 seconds



Wet hands with water;



Right palm over left dorsum with interlaced fingers and vice versa;



Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa;




Dry hands thoroughly with a single use towel;



Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces;



Palm to palm with fingers interlaced;



Rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa;




Use towel to turn off faucet;



Rub hands palm to palm;



Backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked;



Rinse hands with water;


