Updated Advice for Families

The NSW Department of Education recently updated its guidelines for school operations, in line with the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health advice. These guidelines can be accessed from the NSW Department of Education website:

Although many health and safety measures that we have been following remain in place, there are several important points that I would like to bring to everyone's attention:

- Please continue to keep your child at home if they are unwell. If a child develops flu-like symptoms (sore throat, running nose, cough, fever) at school we will call you and you will be required to pick up your child immediately. You will be asked to take your child to a GP and to have your child tested for COVID-19. Your child will be required to isolate until the results are available.

- All students who have had flu-like symptoms (sore throat, running nose, cough, fever) and have either been sent home from school or who have been at home unwell will need to provide a copy of the doctor's certificate giving clearance to be back at school and negative COVID result before they are allowed to return to school and be symptom free.

Normally the result is sent as a text message. A screen shot of that message can then be sent to the school belmoresth-p.school@det.nsw.edu before returning.



Term 4 Staff Development Days

The last two days of each year are called Staff Development Days (SDDs). These are pupil free days. This year the SDDs are scheduled for Thursday 17th December and Friday 18th December. While these days are crucial for staff development, they are not at an optimal time of year to put learning into practice. Belmore South Public School staff participate in additional three hour sessions of professional learning during Term 2, 3 and 4. There will be no teaching staff at school on Thursday 17th December and Friday 18th December. Last day for students will be Wednesday 16th December.

Year 3 Check-in Assessment

Year 3 students will participate in a new reading and numeracy check-in assessment in the coming weeks. The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning following the period of learning from home. The Check-in assessment will identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 3 students from 21 September to 23 October 2020.



Swimming Scheme 2020

Recent changes to the advice regarding the delivery of sport and physical activity within the

Department of Education sector has resulted in the School Swimming and Water Safety program being cancelled for 2020. Sadly, our booking in Term 4 will not go ahead.

We know that it is sad news for the students but we hope that they can understand that their safety is our priority.

Changes to the Opportunity Class placement process for 2020 Year 4 students

To comply with the latest advice from NSW Health to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmissions, the annual Opportunity Class Placement Test will now take place at a student's **own school** rather than in examination centres which bring students from across settings and sectors together.

To allow this change to be made, the test date is now **18 November 2020**.

The department acknowledges the challenges faced by students during the pandemic response. The safety of our students and staff is of paramount importance.

Only students whose parents have received a confirmation email from the High Performing Students Team are eligible to sit the test on the new date of 18 November. The application portal will not be re-opened for new applications.

Placement in an opportunity class will be based solely on the results of the test to ensure the fair and consistent assessment of students across all schools and regions of NSW.

Further details on how this process will be managed will be announced as soon as they are confirmed and we will be communicating directly with all schools who are impacted.

No children on site before 8.30am

Health Care


This is just a reminder that at Belmore South Public School we have many students who have health conditions which include asthma, allergies and anaphylaxis.

Lateness to school

We still have a large number of students who are continually arriving late for school. It is essential to establish a regular routine each morning and arriving at school on time is an important part of your child's morning routine. It is important to be at school on time because:

- It sets up good habits for the future.
- It provides social benefits – good play time and discussion time among friends.
- The school day usually begins with the teacher giving out important information e.g. any changes to routines, collection of notes and upcoming events etc.

Lost Property

As the weather is changeable lately, children often take jumpers and jackets off during the day.

Please ensure that your child's name is written clearly on all school uniform items including school hats.

If your child loses an article of clothing, please call or email the school office who can check with the class teacher as all labelled items are returned to the relevant classroom.

Sadly we can not return or identify unmarked clothing so please make sure you label all clothes, lunch boxes, pencil cases and bags.

Any items not labelled are placed in the Lost Property tubs, please ask your child to check these tubs often for their lost items.

Please have regular conversations with your child about online safety, set rules about internet use and directly supervise the child at all times. The following link is a great tool

It is a federal government resource aimed to support parents, carers, educators and young people in managing the many issues associated with online activity. Through the 'Parents and Carers' tab, multiple topics are covered, such as cyberbullying, gaming and unwanted contact. It supports skill development for parents in areas such as online safety basics, privacy controls and having tricky conversations.

It is always important to monitor your child's online and gaming activity, review the classification and ensure that the content is age appropriate.

For example **Fortnite** has an Australian Classification Board Rating of M recommended for players 15 years and up. **Facebook** and social media accounts such as **Twitter, Instagram, Tik Tok and Snapchat** require users to be at least **13 years old**. This means that Primary Students should not be accessing these sites at all.

If you are collecting your child early, please call the office from the gate and we will escort your child to you.

Emergency Contact Details

An Emergency Contact Form for your child has come home with your child.

We ask that all parents check, amend any details that have changed, sign the form and return to the school asap. Your assistance in this matter is much appreciated.

It is important that the school has up to date contact details in the event that your child becomes ill at school. Children often become distressed when we are unable to contact their parents/carers and it is imperative we have current details on our system. (Grey form)

EXCITING NEW ONLINE ENROLMENT SYSTEM

We are excited to announce we will be rolling out the new Online Enrolment System from Monday, 14 September 2020.

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into **local** schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's [going to a public school site](#).

Enrol Now for Kindergarten 2021

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2021 are now being accepted. Children born between 1st August 2015 and 31st July 2016 are eligible to enrol.

Steps

- Parents/carers who would like to enrol a child for Kindergarten next year, please follow the new ONLINE ENROLMENT SYSTEM from Monday 14 September or download the Application to Enrol from our website <https://education.nsw.gov.au/publicschools/going-to-a-public-school/translated-documentsenrolmentapplication>
- Email the completed form to belmoresth-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- Wait to be contacted by the school for supporting documentation.

Once staff have processed the application form, you will be contacted to make an appointment to come to the school to provide original supporting documentation and have a readiness conversation:

- Child's birth certificate for proof of age
- Passports and visas to verify Residency Status
- 100 point Proof of residence (e.g. Driver's license, council rate notice, gas, rental agreement, electricity account).
- Immunisation Certificate
- Health Plans if required (allergy, asthma, anaphylaxis, etc.)

Please Note

All communications with the school are currently by phone or email. Once you enrol, you will be placed on a mailing list to receive any relevant notifications for Kindergarten 2021.

The *Tell Them From Me* student survey (Term 3, 2020)

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students in Years 4-6 also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 2 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 10 August and 23 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey has being sent home with students in Years 4-6. If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday the 4th of September**.


How do these changes impact our School?

- Parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for students who present as unwell or have flu-like symptoms to be sent home.
- Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test.
- Students must also be symptom free or, for those with existing health conditions such as asthma/allergies have a clearance letter from GP/Doctor before being permitted to return to school.
- Parents/carers and other non-essential visitors are not allowed on the school site.

All other measures in school remain in place including:

- Regularly washing hands and surfaces sanitised regularly.
- No sharing drinks or food. Parents are asked not to send cake or lolly bags for special occasions.
- No Parents or visitors allowed onsite except for contractors under strict operating guidelines.
- Water bottles to be filled from water stations rather than using the bubbler directly. Parents are asked to ensure students attend school with their own personal water bottle.
- Remember to maintain social distance of 1.5 m at the school gates when waiting for your children.

TASK is Belmore South's provider of before and after school care at school. We operate in the school hall from 6:30am-8:30am & 3pm-6pm, every day of school term

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE SESSIONS

TASK is open mornings from 6:30am until 8:30am: breakfast is provided

TASK is open afternoons from 3pm-6pm: afternoon tea, activities & homework included

All children at school OUTSIDE regular school hours must be in the care of an adult to ensure their safety.

Costs vary, depending on your family's level of subsidy

OUR STORY

TASK was started in 2013 by Madi Morrison and Suzanne Tucker – two mums with 3 children each. We were experiencing the chronic shortage of after school care at our own school in Sydney's Inner West. We began as a small homework club – with 5 children (3 of them ours!) with one educator in a classroom. Our aim was to create a place that combined care, play and homework after school. In 2015, we became approved providers of out of school care. We have grown over six years and now operate in Newcastle, the Central Coast, Tweed Heads and Sydney in 15 schools across the public and independent/catholic school systems. **TASK is an ethically private service** – we channel monies back into our programs, people and resources. Madi and Suzanne are joint and equal owners of TASK. We employ 120 people – all of them from the local communities in and around the schools at which we provide service. We are passionate about improving, every day.



 Duration of the entire procedure: 40-60 seconds




0 Wet hands with water;




1 Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces;




2 Rub hands palm to palm;

4 Palm to palm with fingers interlaced;




5 Backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked;



6 Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa;




7 Rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa;




8 Rinse hands with water;





	<p align="center">NO PARKING</p> <p>What does it mean? You are permitted to park for <u>no more than 2 minutes</u> to drop-off/pick-up and you must stay <u>within 3 metres of your vehicle</u>.</p> <p>Why is it there? To provide a safe place for children to be set down and picked up without endangering other children.</p>	<p align="center">Penalty \$191 2 demerit points</p>
	<p align="center">BUS ZONE</p> <p>What does it mean? You must not stop your vehicle in the bus zone unless you are driving a public bus.</p> <p>Why is it there? To provide a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.</p>	<p align="center">Penalty \$344 2 demerit points</p>


